### From the Organ Bench

### Dear SJW Friends,

August 3 marks the start of my seventh month serving as Director of Music and Organist at St. John in the Wilderness! Time does fly when you are having fun.

The past six months have been filled with many "firsts" for me. Beginning my full-time music ministry in January 1981, I had previously only served in an Episcopal church for four months in 1985. Since I joined you in February, I have been busy exploring the wealth of riches in *The Hymnal 1982* and becoming familiar with the three official supplements of the Episcopal Church: *Wonder, Love and Praise; Lift Every Voice and Sing II;* and *Voices Found.* I am so grateful for the guidance of Fr. Josh and the Parish Choir members as I learn what is familiar to the St. John congregation and what

may be new. An enormous thank you to all of you in the congregation who are willing to dive in and sing hymns and service music that may be new to you as well as boldly raising your voices on old favorites.

At Tuesday's staff meeting a few weeks ago, I joked about all the diverse music and worship opportunities that have been offered to me in the last six months: The fun task of learning a new instrument--as every pipe organ is unique! Rite 1 and Rite 2 services were covered in my first two months. Multiple funerals, all with slightly different musical selections. A wedding with 25+ folks in the wedding party alone. A sacred and beautiful Holy Week experience. An awesome Friends of Music and the Arts concert with Tom Keesecker, composer and pianist. Two visits from Bishop José in one month--an ordination and a Pentecost celebration that included an adult baptism by immersion. Wild Wonder week was extraordinary as 60 children and lots of leaders and helpers learned about God's wonderful creation AND raised their voices in song! A month of awesome educational experiences with the Summer Scholar. A great community party at Little Rainbow Row to celebrate the Feast of the Nativity of St. John. And this list could go on and on.

None of this would be possible without the tremendous support and encouragement of you, the people of St. John. You have been so gracious and welcoming to Judy and me! We are still in transition, as our house near Charlotte will go on the market this month, and we will be looking for a home here in the area to replace our monthly rental house. Thank you for your comments and suggestions as I work to enrich the beautiful worship services here at St. John. Thank you to the choir members who show dedication and commitment to leading the church's song. Thank you to the SJW staff, who show their devotion to Christ and the church every day.

Finally, I issue an invitation to those who would like to sing with the choir. We rehearse almost every Wednesday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:30pm in the Wilderness Room and warm-up at 10:10am on Sunday morning. Please let me know if you plan on attending a rehearsal so there will be a choir folder ready for YOU!

Sunday, August 3, 9:30-10:30am, Parish Hall







### You're Invited: End-of-Summer Eucharist



### SJW MTB: Kids Learning to Mountain Bike and Pray

This August, we are introducing a new youth ministry: St. John in the Wilderness Mountain Biking (SJW MTB)! The team is organized by Fr. Josh, who you might know as a longtime outdoorsman, for whom spending time outdoors is a way to feel healthier, calmer, and more connected to the God who shows up in the wilderness of our world and our lives. Fr. Josh started working with kids in youth ministry back in 2009 and has enjoyed taking kids biking, surfing, skiing, and camping ever since. With SJW MTB, we hope to introduce kids to mountain biking as a spiritual practice: a way to have fun with each other and to connect with God.

### Who is SJW MTB for, and what will they learn?

SJW MTB is for kids who can ride a pedal bike without training wheels, who are between the ages of 5 and 5th grade. They should be able to start riding entirely on their own and to stop by using their brakes. (If your kid is not yet 5 but they are turning 5 by the end of 2025, and they can ride a bike, then we would be glad to have them try it out.)

Our team will practice biking basics: starting and stopping on the bikes, shifting, accelerating, turning and cornering, going over obstacles, riding skinnies, and even small jumps. We hope to safely work on some street riding skills, also, for the older kids. In prayer, we will learn the basics of Evening Prayer and include Bible stories, the Lord's Prayer, and the 23rd Psalm in our worship.

#### When and where will the team meet?

The team will meet at St. John in the Wilderness, with a couple of "bonus ride" excursions to other local trails. The initial season will be Wednesdays between August 20 and October 22. Riders should arrive at 5:45pm and be ready to roll by 6:00pm. We will use the back Parish Hall parking lot to practice basic skills, since everyone regardless of skill level needs to work on form, shifting, braking, and bike handling. Then we will use our new trail system, The Trails of St. John, to ride some singletrack. We will use the Wilderness Chapel (part of our trail system), Atrium Chapel, historic church, or woods as places to pray each week.

### How much is it, and how do I sign up?

The cost is \$50 per rider, which includes a team t-shirt. A waiver must be signed by the first practice. Scholarships are available as needed. **Sign up at www.stjohnflatrock.org/sjw-mtb**.

We also hope you will sign up for our the Kids' MTB race on September 6--see more information about that on page 7!

### Save the Date: Grand Opening of The Trails of St. John

Saturday, September 6 and Sunday, September 7

It's official: St. John in the Wilderness will open our new trail system on the weekend of September 6-7! The Trails of St. John will be open to the public from dawn to dusk each day, with rules posted at the kiosks that you will be able to find on the church property. The grand opening of The Trails of St. John includes a kids' mountain bike race on Saturday morning, which you can sign up and pay for at <a href="https://www.stjohnflatrock.org/sjw-mtb">www.stjohnflatrock.org/sjw-mtb</a>, and a ribbon cutting with historical hikes on Sunday at 1:00pm. No sign up is needed to attend the ribbon cutting.

The story of how these trails came to be is a beautiful example of grace, hard work, and rediscovery. Five years ago, Fr. Josh started a ministry called Holy Hikes of WNC, which takes groups hiking each month for a time of recreation and prayer. Shortly after that, the church began working with a member named Rivers Stone who wanted to build an outdoor meeting space somewhere on the church property. Rivers sadly passed away unexpectedly during this time, but he very generously left resources for the church to use however the vestry discerned would be helpful.

Over the years, there has been talk of the old Jerusalem Path, which was developed in the mid-1800s for parishioners to be able to walk to the church. The path was mostly a distant memory, except for one small section of it that was still visible near the historic parsonage of the parish. As the Holy Hikes ministry kept growing, the idea of having trails on our own property sounded more and more interesting, including restoring the historic Jerusalem Path so people could walk from the church to the Carl Sandburg National Historic Site, immersing themselves in the complicated history of this holy place along the way. The Trails Subcommittee of Holy Hikes of WNC began to work on planning a trail system that would include narrower singletrack trails and a wider gravel path to be called "The New Jerusalem Path." They selected Todd Branham with Long Cane Trails as a trail designer and builder. He seemed to understand how these trails were to be part of the church's identity – the church's story.

In the lead-up to the grand opening of the trails, we'll be telling more of that story, so look out for more to come! In the meantime, please save the date for this special weekend, noting the tentative schedule of events to the right. We're looking forward to celebrating this monumental occasion with you and hope that the trails will be a blessing for both our parishioners and for the broader community.


